Tyrone E. Couey (Ty) is a founding member and President of the National Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Alumni Associations Foundation. This organization procures resources for a holistic partnership at federal, state, local governments, local communities for profit and nonprofits, civic and local churches to expand, lead, develop, and advocate for HBCU's and their alumni. The National HBCU Alumni Associations Foundation fulfills this purpose through advocacy groups, national, global, community-based services, projects, and programs on issues of education, technology innovation, research, Science Technology Engineering Mathematics (STEM) and economic empowerment/financial literacy.

Ty was also the founder and President for the National Organization of College Parents (NOCP), Inc. NOCP was a non-profit organization that provided technical assistance, services, and resources to HBCUs to assist students matriculate in undergraduate studies and successfully obtain employment and career development. Because of his leadership and vision for this organization, Ty received the 50 Powerful US/International Business Executives Award from the MEA Magazine.

Ty served as president for the DC Hampton University Parents Club, Inc. He was elected to four terms, while his daughter attended and graduated summa cum laude from Hampton University in Hampton, Virginia.

A native New Yorker, Ty was raised in Englewood, New Jersey. He graduated from Utah State University earning a B.S. degree in History and was drafted immediately by the Dallas Cowboys. He received a Certificate in Negotiation for Senior Executives from Harvard University; Certificate in Philanthropy from Indiana University; Master's Certificate of Data Communications from New York Institute; Certificate in Finance from New York University; attended Federal Executive Institute; and furthered his education taking graduate studies in Business and Telecommunications at Pace University and University of Maryland.

Ty draws on his managerial leadership at Fortune 500 Corporations, Federal agencies (White House Initiative on HBCUs), serves as a member of Bowie State University College of Arts and Sciences Board of Advisors, President of American Federation of Government Employees (AFGE) Local 32, Presidential Appointee to Selective Service Board, taught Black History and college and professional football experience in teamwork to help him build successful partnerships, coalitions and to inspire leadership in his community work.
